The first mentor-mentee meeting of the Department of Hotel Management, Quantum University, academic session 2019-20 (Odd Sem) was held on 22/02/2020. The meeting was preceded by the mentor Ms. Sarika, 10 mentees were present and 5 of them were absent.

In this meeting mentees: Some mentees, namely Harsh Kamboj and Golu Kumar have raised concerns regarding their financial constraints as a restraint to registering in the ERP. They also asked information regarding the availability, eligibility criteria, and application processes for scholarships offered by the University.

Mentees were advised to register on ERP and mentor discussed their financial issue with the Department Coordinator. The department coordinator escalated this matter to the University Registrar, who, after due consideration, granted a one-month extension for fee submission.

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Another problem was raised by the mentees, They wanted to know all about the upcoming Industrial Training program. They need this information to get ready for their interviews and be well-prepared

#### Mentor gave details about industrial training such as-

After the end of the semester, DEEPRO will provide students with a training letter. Subsequently, students will require presenting this letter to the respective company as part of their process to commence their industrial training.

Hostel residents have voiced concerns regarding two critical issues. Firstly, there were sanitation and hygiene issues in the hostel toilets that need immediate attention and resolution. Secondly, the availability of clean and safe drinking water.

Mentor discussed this issue with the Warden of the hostel.

To address these concerns, the hostel management (warden) had initiated immediate measures to improve sanitation and hygiene in the hostel toilets. A thorough cleaning schedule and routine inspections have been implemented to ensure a cleaner environment. Additionally, steps have been taken to provide a continuous supply of clean and safe drinking water, with regular quality checks to maintain water purity.

In the **second meeting** date: 15/04/2020 (via online mode) 12 mentees were present and 3 of them were absent. Mentees: Aashish Giri, Abhinav Rana, Gaurav Singh Bisht have issue that they are unable to connect online class properly due to network issue.

Problem in connecting online class due to poor network connectivity matter was noted and this matter discussed with department coordinator. Class notes will be shared with the students through class whatsapp group.

Two students Aashish Giri and Gaurav Singh Bisht give health reasons for not joining the class regularly.

Students who gave the health reason and unable to join class issue was noted and discussed with the coordinator. Coordinator decided that extra classes will be arranged for these students and class notes provided to the students through whatsapp group and Google derive.

A short counseling was given by the mentor to the students on taking care of health.

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Another problem was shared by the mentees that they have exhibited low attendance, citing health-related reasons and challenges associated with poor network connectivity as contributing factors.

Mentor advised students having low attendance to join classes regularly.

Mentor also recommended that students be encouraged to sit within areas with reliable network connectivity during classes to ensure their active participation and uninterrupted attendance. Students who gave the health reason and unable to join class issue was noted and discussed with the coordinator. Coordinator decided that extra classes will be arranged for these students and class notes provided to the students through whatsapp group and Google derive.

A short counseling was given by the mentor to the students on taking care of health.

No other issue raised by the mentees in these meetings.
