### Minutes of Mentor-Mentee

Date: 20/12/2022

A mentor-mentee meeting was held during each semester in each session twice or thrice as per the guidance of University. The First mentor-mentee meeting of in Bachelor of Science in Nutrition and Dietetics was held for academic session 2022-23 Semester 1<sup>st</sup>, on 31<sup>st</sup> August, 2022 in room B-111.

### **Discussion Points:**

During the mentor meeting the students shared their difficulties and expressed their grievances to the mentor. The following points were discussed in meetings:

In the First meeting, 11 mentees were present and 8 were absent at venue B-111. In this

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meeting issues raised by the mentees: ABHISHEK KUMAR, PRIVA BHADULA about Library book bank issue that when they will get books. By mentor it is forwarded to library head.

Second issue was raised by the mentees: ADIBA MALIK, SMITA SHARMA, LINDUM YAYU asked about when they will get uniform. Convinced them that it will take a little time. And forward the same issue to uniform incharge.

Another issue raised by mentees was personal issues. Mentor advised foster confidence by providing opportunities for friendship.

In the Second Meeting, held on 18<sup>th</sup> Oct, 2022 at venue B-111 in which 16 mentee was present and 03 mentees were absent. Mentees: NASHRA, AASTHA KAUSHAL, LINDUM YAYU discussed to access the study material. This issue forwarded to subject teacher and they will provide appropriate study material to the students in the form of soft and hard copy, online material, video links.

Another issue raised was mentees: Smita Sharma, Ch Webuilui, Kanchan Tiwari, Aastha Kaushal raised concerns about internet facility issues in hostel. Hostel related issues were forwarded to the concern authorities and the problem has been resolved within 2, 3 days through the LMD Department with the help of IT Cell.

Another issue was raised by the mentees: Adiba Malik, Smita Sharma, Ankur Kumar wants to make changes in their minor subject. Mentor informed to the minor coordinator Mr. Deepak Bhatt to make necessary changes in their subjects.

Next issue was Students: ABHISHEK KUMAR, AASHU TOMAR AASTHA KAUSHAL, JIYA MOURYA was facing problems in Gave extra time for clearing doubts and worked out more problems to concrete the concept. Provided the environment for peer tutoring so that their doubts can be clear and they will motivate for self study regularly.

Next issue raised by Student: ADIBA MALIK complaint that they have lack of confidence.

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Motivated the students to organize events to increase their organizational, communicative and leadership qualities.

In the Third Meeting, held on 10<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 at venue B-110 in which 16 mentee was present and 3 mentees were absent. Students: CH WEBUILUI, NASHRA AQSA NASIR raised problem about drinking water problem. Another issue raised by mentees: JIYA MOURYA, NAMEERA KHAN is not showing their interest in academics. In a one-on-one conversation, the mentor learned that the mentees are uninterested in academics mostly because they do not find the subject engaging. This issue was then brought up in Sub Specialty Group, where the participants made the decision to explore potential modifications to the teaching pedagogy. In order to spark and sustain students' interest in academics, they encouraged the faculties to make education more practically focused than theoretical.

Another issue was raised by mentees: Abhishek Kumar, Aqsa Nasir, Aastha Kaushal, Richa Sharma were confused about the paper pattern and how much they have to write. Mentor explained paper pattern and method how to write and how much they have to write for a particular subject.

Another issue raised was Mentees: JIYA MOURYA, VIPUL SAINI, KANCHAN TIWARI, SAMYUKTA SARGAM raised the challenge of managing time while completing the assigned academic-focused duties was acknowledged by mentees. The mentor set up a counseling session for the mentees, carefully listened to their particular issues, and gave advice on how to fit into the university's academic system.

In the **Fourth Meeting**, held on 6<sup>th</sup> Dec, 2022 at venue B-111 in which 12 mentee was present and 7 mentees were absent. Mentors discussed the difficulty they had finishing assignments because of a lack of direction. 004. This meeting was preceded by the mentor Dr. Krishna Kumar Pande. In this meeting, 10 mentees were present and 05 were absent.

### Agenda:

In the First meeting, held on dated 20<sup>th</sup> October, 2022 mentees: Nripesh Kumar Moktan, Sirjan Kumar Shahi, Himanshu Raj, Siddharth Singh, Sunil Sharma and Anshul Kumar asked for proper arrangement of furniture, regular cleaning in class room and cold drinking water. In response to the requests made by the mentees a thorough assessment of the classroom was conducted by Coordinator of the Department. Then mentor and coordinator discussed specific issues, which were subsequently escalated to the LMD and the problems were successfully resolved within a mere two-day. Secondly to cater to the need for cold drinking water, a water dispenser with chilled water was installed in campus.

Next issue raised by mentees the collection of industrial project. Mentees: Sunil Sharma, Anshul Kumar, Atul Raj, Aditya Raj raised concerns regarding the necessity of being informed about the summer internship report format. A thorough solution was put in place to allay the mentees' worries over the structure of the summer internship reports. All participants received a comprehensive guide on the format, content, and organization of internship reports, along with specific instructions on how to submit their reports within the allotted time frame.

Another issue by mentees was related to extra classes for GATE preparation. The mentees: Avayman Singh, Abhijeet Saini and Durgeshmahaseth wanted aptitude classes for preparing for the Graduate Aptitude Test in Engineering (GATE). The mentor and coordinator addressed the students' desire for aptitude lessons to help them prepare for the GATE, and the request was then forwarded to the appropriate authority. To address their needs, the institution moved proactively. There were now specialized GATE aptitude classes available, with an emphasis on problem-solving, logic, and mathematics.

In the **Second Meeting**, dated 29/11/22, 10 mentees were present and 05 were absent. The issue raised by the mentees was related extension of time assigned for project. Mentees:

Aditya Raj, Aizaz Ahmed, Avayman Singh, Abhijeet Saini, and Prins Surya informed that normal assignment time is normally 10 days. Students requested to extend the timing of submission of applied assignments/projects based assignments to 21 days. Therefore there should be more time granted for submission of the assignments

Under the category of issues raised the mentees shown their concern regarding uncertainty of their career after passing out from the university. Some Mentees: Durgesh Mahaseth, Prins Surya said about uncertainty of future and the transition to post-college life. They were confused about work life balance. The mentor found that the students those find themselves uncertain regarding their career are week in their studies. There marks until six semesters are below the acceptable limit (6.5 CGPA). The mentor guided them to work hard for the studies. The following measures were suggested: Explore internships, volunteer work, or part-time jobs for experience. Focus on continuous learning and skill development. Build a strong online presence and update your LinkedIn profile.

Next issue was Interview preparation and raised by mentees: Himanshu Raj, Siddharth Singh, Sunil Sharma, Anshul Kumar and Atul Raj asked for workshops, demo classes for interview and career guidance programs. Mentor discussed this request with coordinator and Coordinator contacted the Placement Cell (DEEPRO) to conducted mock interviews, workshops and career counseling programs for the final year students.

In the **Third** meeting dated 08/12/2022, 12 mentees were present and 03 were absent. The mentees: Atul Raj, Mohd Kaif, Prakhar Gupta, Aizaz Ahmed, Avayman Singh and Abhijeet Saini have expressed a need for additional revision sessions.
