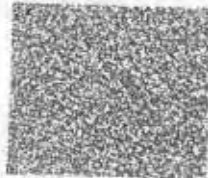

BETWEEN

QUANTUM UNIVERSITY, a University in the State of Uttarakhand, India established under Quantum University Uttarakhand Act 2016 (Uttarakhand Act No. 04 of 2017) (herein referred to as "University").

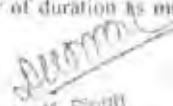
AND

Ashok Leyland, a Company duly incorporated under the Companies Act, 1956 having its Registered Office at No.1, Sardar Patel Road, Guindy, Chennai, Tamil Nadu-600032, India and having one of its Manufacturing Facility/Unit situated at Plot No.1, Sector 12, IIE, SIDCUL, Pantnagar, District Udham Singh Nagar, Uttarakhand (herein referred to as "Industry Partner"), including all its group companies/offices existing presently or which may come into existence in the future.

In consideration of the above, the parties agree to enter into this Educational Cooperation Agreement for the performance of external training placements which shall be governed by the following

- A. Whereas the University agrees to declare the high interest that practical training has for students enrolled in Vocational programmes, which helps them apply and complement the knowledge acquired in their academic training, promoting the acquisition of skills to train them for exercising professional activities, facilitate their possibility of being employed and also promote their capacity for entrepreneurship.
- B. In order to provide **On-The-Job** training to students enrolled under University's skill based Bachelor in Vocational Programme (Automobile) i.e. Certificate, Diploma and Degree programme of 3 years duration or of duration as mutually agreed from time to time.

C. University therefore proposes to associate with Ashok Leyland Ltd. to provide necessary support in imparting these programs through Partnership model by providing on-the-job training to the students enrolled for such courses.

D. In order to ensure Quality standards of hands on training to students, University wishes to appoint Ashok Leyland training Provider i.e. Smart Skills for smooth delivery of this vocational programme under the following agreed terms and conditions:

- Students enrolled under the Programme will undergo classroom training at the University's or its designated Center(s) including that of Smart Skills i.e. Center of Technical Excellence, Amrawati Colony, Phase-2, Tuli Bazar, Haldwani.
- University in its campus and Smart Skills in its centre will provide the necessary infrastructure to conduct classroom training from time to time.
- Contribute to the integral training of students, by helping them acquire both theoretical and practical learning in accordance with curriculum / syllabus requirements.

E. Both the parties herein being desirous of taking up a partnership project have decided to enter into this present MOU on a non-exclusive basis.

NOW IT IS HEREBY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

1. Responsibilities of First Party- Quantum University

- a. Shall, after receipt of the processed applications and fees from students, finalize the admissions jointly with the Industry Partner.
- b. Shall arrange to conduct the examinations and arrange to announce the results as per schedule.
- c. Shall ensure that agreed share of 70% of the course fee per candidate is disbursed to Smart Skills as per agreed schedule.

- d. Shall arrange to issue Certificate/ Diploma/Degree to the successful students
- e. Shall issue notifications and advertisements regarding the admission to the courses and examination from time to time along with other courses run by the University.
- f. Shall keep its website updated on information on courses conducted in pursuance of this MOU from time to time.

2. Responsibilities of Second Party- Ashok Leyland Ltd.

- a. Shall impart coaching and supervision to student during on-the-job training as per the schedule applicable.
- b. Extend technical support, if required, by sending in-house experts for teaching purposes.
- c. Provide support to student in terms of monthly stipend/lunch/transportation and any other incentive during on-the job training as per company norms.
- d. Provide on-the-job training to a minimum number of 500 students of the aforementioned courses in a year. This figure may increase or decrease depending upon various factors and company's discretion.

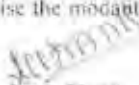
3. Duration of agreement

The agreement shall be valid for a period of three (3) years from the date of signing of this agreement and is renewable thereafter on mutually agreed revised terms and conditions.

4. Admission cycle and examinations

There will be continuous admission cycle every three months from the start of the new batch however two examinations (theory and/or practical) will be held per year at the gap of six months between them. However, the Academic Council of Quantum University on the recommendations of the Board of Studies can revise the modalities from time to time.

5. The Parties hereto agree to enter into this M O U on a Principal-to-Principal basis and none of the Parties shall do or cause to be done anything derogatory to the reputation of the other.
6. During the term of this M O U and thereafter for reasonable period, all the Parties hereto undertake on behalf of their respective sub-contractors / employees / representatives / associates to maintain strict confidentiality and prevent disclosure thereof, of all the information and data exchanged / generated pertaining to work / activity under this MOU for any purpose other than that specified in this MOU.
7. None of the Parties will be held responsible for non-fulfillment of their respective obligations under this MOU due to the exigencies of one or more of the force majeure events such as but not limited to acts of God, war, flood, earthquakes, strikes, lock-outs, epidemics, riots, civil commotions, etc., or for any other reason beyond the control of the Parties, provided on the occurrence and cessation of any such events, the Party affected thereby shall give a notice in writing to the other Party within one month of such occurrence or cessation. If the force majeure conditions continue beyond six months, the Parties shall jointly decide about the future course of action.
8. During the Tenure of this Agreement / MOU, Parties hereto may terminate the agreement either for breach of the terms and conditions of the agreement or otherwise by giving 03 (three) months notice in writing to the defaulting / Other Party. Any such termination shall not affect the smooth Course completion of the existing batch of students and upon serving of notice of termination by any of the Parties.

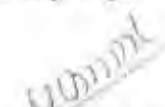

Lien on Employment:

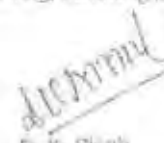
Student trainee referred and sponsored by the University will have no lien for the permanent / temporary employment in the Company where s/he is undergoing on - the - job training. However, preference may be given depending upon their performance for engaging them against temporary nature of work as and when requirement arises and subject to vacancies. However, it will be at the sole discretion of the Industry Partner.

Status of the on - the - job trainee Vis a Vis the Company:

The on - the - job trainee(s) shall not have any lien of appointment, employment in the Company and at no point of time will be deemed to be an / the employee(s) of the Company and or on its rolls and records. Except for the stipend, lunch being provided during the course of the training, the trainee student referred, sponsored by the University shall not in any way or manner or for the purposes of applicable Labour Enactments be treated or deemed to be employees of the Company.

It is clearly understood that the persons sponsored or referred by the University for the on - the - job training are enrolled students of the University and will be referred for such training as part of their academic curriculum. Hence as student trainees they will not be amenable to or covered under the provisions of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948, the EPI and MP Act, 1952, the ESI Act, 1948, and other Enactments otherwise applicable upon the Company. Neither the referred student trainees will be liable for taking, obtaining any benefits there under.

- 1.5 The above mentioned program is intended to be launched in Academic year 2019-20.
- 1.6 QUANTUM UNIVERSITY and Xebia agrees to start the course with minimum 15 (Fifteen) students in the program with no guarantee commitment in first year of commencement of the program. From the second academic year, QUANTUM UNIVERSITY agrees to guarantee minimum billing of 20 (Twenty) new students per year in each program. From the third Academic year onwards, QUANTUM UNIVERSITY agrees to guarantee a minimum billing of 25 (Twenty Five) new students each year in the program.

2. Roles and Responsibilities

3.1.10. QUANTUM UNIVERSITY to publish approved curriculum as part of QUANTUM UNIVERSITY programs to be launched in industry academic collaboration with Xebia.

3.1.11. QUANTUM UNIVERSITY will take care of all boarding, lodging and transfers to & from the local Airport for any of the visiting Xebia team, faculty and industry SMEs at QUANTUM UNIVERSITY campus. The stay should be in a comfortable, decently furnished guest house at QUANTUM UNIVERSITY campus.

4. Program Administration Process

4.1. **Joint Coordination Committee:** To coordinate the execution of the activities agreed under this Agreement, QUANTUM UNIVERSITY and Xebia shall constitute a Joint Co-ordination Committee (hereinafter referred to as "JCC") whose members and roles will be as listed under Clause 4.2.

4.2. The Vice-Chancellor of QUANTUM UNIVERSITY or his nominee as the Chairperson; two representatives from each party as members, a Project Coordinator from QUANTUM UNIVERSITY who shall also be the Convener of the Committee. Convener of the committee may recommend changes in the membership from time to time in consultation with the nominating parties and the same shall be approved by the Vice Chancellor, QUANTUM UNIVERSITY.

4.3. The JCC meeting shall have due representation from both QUANTUM UNIVERSITY and Xebia to take decisions related to this Agreement.

4.3. The JCC shall make recommendations on program curriculum, content and its delivery, for approval by the Vice Chancellor, QUANTUM UNIVERSITY through the Academic Council of the University.

4.4. The JCC shall monitor and review the activities under this Agreement and recommend such actions or decisions with respect to any aspect regarding this Agreement for the purpose of removing any impediment, promoting the programs arising from this Agreement, approving the content and recommending changes therein.

5. Deployment of Human Resources

5.1. Xebia and QUANTUM UNIVERSITY shall provide considerable academic support and sales/marketing resources to market and administer the programs offered under this Agreement.

5.2. Xebia shall provide adequate number of Xebia's internal and industry subject matter experts for curriculum development/update and interaction with students/faculty, program support and administration besides marketing resources to propagate the new programs.

5.3. Xebia shall provide Xebia expert to arrange student's workshop as and when required and mutually consented for enriching the course at campus of QUANTUM UNIVERSITY.

6. Commercial terms

6.1. QUANTUM UNIVERSITY shall pay to Xebia fees as per the agreed commercials attached in the Annexure-1.



- 6.2 The commercials offered in Annexure-1 are only for the 2019-2020 intake and applicable for the entire 4-year term of the program.
- 6.3 The Xebia fees will be increased by 10% on annual basis starting April 1, 2021. However, the fee shall be payable for net enrollments in a semester (after withdrawals and subject to a minimum payment of 25 students per course) and will be paid within 45 days of start of each semester. In case of nonpayment of dues, Xebia has the right to terminate the agreement without any notice period.
- 6.4 Per student per semester fees doesn't include any applicable taxes such as GST etc. If any authority imposes under this Agreement a duty, tax, levy, or fee, excluding those based on Xebia's net income, then QUANTUM UNIVERSITY agrees to pay that amount as specified in an invoice, unless QUANTUM UNIVERSITY supplies exemption documentation.
- 6.5 QUANTUM UNIVERSITY shall deduct applicable taxes under the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961 ("the Act") in respect of the payments due to Xebia and remit such Taxes Deducted at Source ("TDS") to the credit of the Government Account, file quarterly TDS returns under the provisions of the Act or such other law in force, furnish TDS certificates and comply with any other requirement connected thereto as required under the provisions of the Act. Further, QUANTUM UNIVERSITY shall ensure that the Permanent Account Number ("PAN") of Xebia is quoted correctly in such quarterly TDS returns or any other document where the PAN of Xebia is required to be mentioned.
- 6.6 Time and Material rates – Consulting services provided with the prior approval of QUANTUM UNIVERSITY will be charged at the additional time and material hourly rates that will be agreed separately with QUANTUM. These rates apply to any services that are not described in this MOU, such as SME access for any custom course development, training programs for faculty & students, additional manpower for student-parent counseling, marketing and promotional events and conferences, etc.

7. Term and Termination

- 7.1 This Agreement shall be initially valid for period of 10 (Ten) academic year intakes ending on 30th June 2028 and terms for renewal of this agreement post 30th June 2028 shall be mutually discussed & agreed upon by 30th Jan 2028. In case the agreement is not renewed, students admitted till expiry of the agreement will be taught out till conclusion of their programs at prevailing rates per student per semester.
- 7.2 If at any time any party wishes to withdraw from this Agreement, it may do so with or without any cause by providing the other party with a one-year notice after minimum of 2 years of the first intake. This intention to terminate this agreement must be provided in writing. Notwithstanding such termination, all students admitted to these programs prior to such termination shall be taught out by both parties wherein each party would be bound to provide its services as enumerated in this Agreement. Xebia will continue to be paid for the services rendered to such students even after the notice of termination is provided.
- 7.3 In case of non-payment, Xebia has the right to terminate the agreement without any notice.
- 7.4 In case of 'Under service performance'/'poor quality deliverables', QUANTUM UNIVERSITY has the right to terminate the agreement without any notice.

8. Confidentiality

- 8.1 The existence and substance of this Agreement and the provision of services contemplated hereby shall be kept confidential and shall not be disclosed to any party hereto to any third party without the prior written consent of the other party hereto unless such disclosure is necessitated by due process of law. In all cases where disclosures are necessitated by law, the other party shall be kept duly informed of the same.
- 8.2 Our mutual objective under this Agreement is to provide protection for confidential information (Information) while maintaining our ability to conduct our respective business activities. Each of us agrees that the following terms apply when one of us (Discloser) discloses Information to the other (Recipient).

8.2.1 Disclosure

Information shall be disclosed either:

- a) In writing;
- b) By delivery of items;
- c) By initiation of access to information, such as may be in a data base; or
- d) By oral or visual presentation.

- 8.2.2 Information should be marked with a restrictive legend of the Discloser. If information is not marked with such legend or is disclosed orally, the information shall be identified as confidential at the time of disclosure.

8.3 Obligations

The Recipient agrees to:

- 8.3.1 Use the same care and discretion to avoid disclosure, publication or dissemination of the Discloser's Information as it uses with its own similar information that it does not wish to disclose, publish or disseminate; and
- 8.3.2 Use the Discloser's Information for the purpose for which it was disclosed or otherwise for the benefit of the Discloser.
- 8.3.3 The Recipient may disclose Information to:

its employees who have a need to know, and employees of any legal entity that it controls, controls it, or with which it is under common control, who have a need to know. Control means to own or control, directly or indirectly, over 50% of voting shares; and
Any other party with the Discloser's prior written consent.

Before disclosure to any of the above parties, the Recipient shall have a written agreement with the party sufficient to require that party to treat information in accordance with this Agreement.

9. Limitation of Liability

- 9.1 In the event of any breach of the terms of this Agreement, which is capable of rectification, by either party hereto, such other party shall be entitled to call upon the party to rectify such breach within Thirty days from the date of the notice, failing which the breach shall be deemed to be a material breach, and shall entitle such other party to terminate this Agreement for material breach.
- 9.2 A breach of any of the provisions contained in this Agreement may result in irreparable and continuing damage to QUANTUM UNIVERSITY for which there may be no adequate remedy at law, and thus QUANTUM UNIVERSITY shall be entitled to equitable or injunctive relief and/or a decree for specific performance (in addition to all other remedies which may be available to it at law), and such other relief as a court may deem just and proper
- 9.3 A breach of any of the provisions contained in this Agreement may result in irreparable and continuing damage to Xebia for which there may be no adequate remedy at law, and thus Xebia shall be entitled to equitable or injunctive relief and/or a decree for specific performance (in addition to all other remedies which may be available to it at law), and such other relief as a court may deem just and proper.

10. Indemnification

- 10.1 Both parties have agreed to bear the responsibility for any third party claims, demands, proceedings, prosecutions, or actions against the defaulting party, arising out of and as a result of any callous, negligent, deficient action or omission by the defaulting party and has undertaken to keep the aggrieved party indemnified against all losses and damages including expenses incurred by the aggrieved party while defending the claim (inclusive of legal expenses) in any court as a result of any such claim, demands, proceedings, prosecutions or actions. Besides this, Xebia warrants as:

10.1.1 Xebia is the sole developer and owner of the content supplied under this Agreement and it has rights in the use of the said content in any manner. Any additional content developed by university for enrichment of the program or fulfillment of the degree will be owned by the University.

10.1.2 Xebia shall ensure the final material developed is adequately plagiarism free.

11. Publicity

- 11.1 Xebia agrees allowing QUANTUM UNIVERSITY to use its trademarks, trade names, services marks or other proprietary marks under this Agreement with due permission (electronic or printed) for any advertising, press releases, publicity or marketing collaterals without any prior consent of Xebia during the tenure of this Agreement.



11.2 QUANTUM UNIVERSITY agrees allowing Xebia to use its trademarks, trade names, services marks or other proprietary marks under this Agreement with due permission (electronic or printed) for any advertising, press releases, publicity or marketing collaterals without any prior consent of QUANTUM UNIVERSITY during the tenure of this Agreement.

12. Governing Law

12.1 This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of India, without regard to its conflict of laws provision.

13. Arbitration

13.1 Except for seeking injunction from the court of competent jurisdiction, every dispute, difference, or question which may at any time arise between the parties hereto or any person claiming under them, touching or arising out of or in respect of this agreement or the subject matter thereof shall be referred to a sole arbitrator to be appointed by a mutual agreement between the parties and if failing to agree to appoint such mutually acceptable arbitrator, to two arbitrators one to be appointed by each party to the difference and in case of difference of opinion between them to an umpire appointed by the said two arbitrators before entering on the reference and the decision of the arbitrator (or such arbitrators, or umpire as the case may be) shall be final and binding on the parties. The seat of arbitration shall be New Delhi/Dehradun as decided mutually.

14. General

14.1 This Agreement supersedes all prior proposals and discussions on this subject and is the complete and exclusive statement of the agreement between the parties. This Agreement cannot be modified except by a written agreement signed by the authorized representative of each of the QUANTUM UNIVERSITY and Xebia IT Architects India Pvt. Ltd. Any reproduction of this Agreement by reliable means shall be considered an original of this document.

14.2 Each party shall be responsible for its own expenses in connection with these discussions.

14.3 Each Party shall act as an independent contractor. No agency, partnership, joint venture or other joint relationship is created by this Agreement. Neither Party may make any commitments binding on the other, nor may either Party make any representation that they are acting for, or on behalf of, the other.

14.4 Neither of the parties may assign, or otherwise transfer, its rights or delegate its duties or obligations under this Agreement without prior written consent of the other party. Any attempt to do so is void.

15. Notice

15.1 Any notice herein may be given if sent by hand delivery and written acknowledgement obtained thereof or by Registered A.D. to the afore-mentioned Program Manager/Nodal Officer of parties at their respective addresses / E-Mail Ids mentioned herein below and shall if so sent be deemed to be duly delivered. The parties agree to notify in writing any change of address in which case the notice under this clause shall be sent at the changed address;

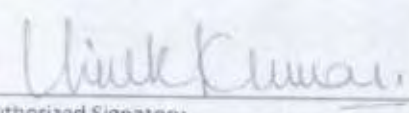

And

Quantum University, formed and enacted through the Quantum University Act, 2016 (Uttarakhand Act No 04 of 2017), having its registered office at 4th Floor, 14 Gandhi Road, DehraDun India, through its Vice Chairman, Mr Shobhit Goyal Aged about 35, R/o of 14/1 New Road, DehraDun, duly authorised by virtue of the Board Resolution dated 1st March, 2018, [hereinafter referred to as the "the University", which expression shall, unless it be repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, shall mean and include himself, its successors, and assigns] as the party of the OTHER PART.

The terms "Quick Heal" shall mean and include "Quick Heal Academy" or "QHA" and "SEQRITE Services" or "SQS". The Service Provider and Client shall individually be referred to as the "Party" and collectively as "Parties".

WHEREAS:

Any such Amendments / addendum may be executed in counterparts each of which when executed and delivered shall be an original but together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

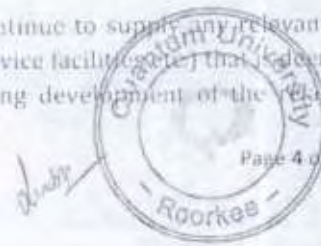
3. TERM AND TERMINATION

- I. This MoU shall be effective from 6th March 2018 ("Effective Date") and shall continue to be in effect for a period of 4 (Four) years till 2022 ("Term"). However, upon expiry of the Term, the Parties may renew this MoU for further period on mutually agreed terms and conditions.
- II. Either party may terminate this MoU at any time by giving a notice of 6 month or completion of the semester term whichever is later in writing to the other party.
- III. Upon the expiration or termination of this MoU for any reason, (a) all amounts not disputed in good faith that are owed by University to QHA which accrued before such expiration or termination will be immediately due and payable, (b) University shall return or destroy, Confidential Information in accordance with the provisions of Section 5, and (c) QHA shall ensure the successful completion of the semester for which due consideration has been paid to QHA.

4. OBLIGATIONS OF PARTIES

4.1 Both PARTIES will:

- 4.1.1 Identify a staff member from their respective organization to be the point of contact for all general enquiries, administrative needs and for the coordination of activities leading to the development of the working plan.
- 4.1.2 Bring to the attention of all PARTIES any issue which may affect the nature of the relationship or the conditions of any future agreement.
- 4.1.3 Continue to supply any relevant information (on, for example, curricula, service facilities etc.) that is deemed necessary by the PARTIES for the on-going development of the relationship, the production of the working

- 4.1.5 Seek permission and guidance from any relevant internal (e.g. committees) or external bodies (e.g. professional associations and government regulatory authorities) to ensure that the relationship and any formal MoU is appropriately reviewed and approved.
- 4.1.6 Bear their own costs of any activity relating to this agreement, unless agreed in writing (in advance) or detailed separately and specifically in this document.
- 4.1.7 Maintain strict confidentiality of all information as may come to the knowledge of either of the PARTIES during their performance under this Agreement.

4.2. QHA

- 4.2.1. QHA shall be involved in designing and execution of the Programme, in consultation with the University.
- 4.2.2. QHA shall coordinate with expert faculty members and help to ensure lectures are conducted as per approved syllabus in timely manner.

- 4.2.7. QHA shall assist the University and provide reference books in the electronic form for the Programme.
- 4.2.8. QHA will also bear reasonable expenses related to replication- of lectures material, reference material, articles etc., requisite for the Programme for distribution to the students enrolled for the Programme.
- 4.2.9. QHA will provide assistance to the University in the process of marketing of the courses. The marketing process shall be mutually decided by the Parties;
- 4.2.10. QHA may outsource the marketing and business development activity to a third party to maximum enrolment for the Programme.
- 4.2.11. QHA will ensure adequate supervision to ensure performance of the Services in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement. In case of any deficiency in the Services the University shall immediately bring it to the notice of QHA;

4.3. QUANTUM UNIVERSITY

- 4.3.1. The University shall handle and shall be responsible for all the admission process, which also includes selection and enrolment of the students for the Programme. All the documentation and information related to admission process shall be discussed and mutually agreed between QHA and the University. The University and QHA may amend the process from time to time for smoothening the overall process and in benefit of the collaboration in a reasonable manner. All the documents and the information related to admissions shall be jointly monitored by QHA and the University. All expenses for the same shall be borne by the University.
- 4.3.2. The University shall arrange and provide reasonable office space, computers, internet, printer and other requisite infrastructure, including but not limited to technical infrastructure, for conducting this Programme within the University campus.
- 4.3.3. The University shall procure at its own cost tools and technologies in consultaion with QHA.
- 4.3.4. In case QHA appoint an agency for marketing or business development activity in such scenarios QHA may authorise such agency to utilise the said office space provided by the University.

- 4.3.5. The University shall arrange for and shall be responsible for the remuneration of the requisite staff for management of the classrooms, office space, and overall infrastructure of the Programme and related activities. Parties shall mutually discuss such requirements of requisite staff and infrastructure and design the strategy accordingly.

- 4.3.10. The University shall have all permission and licenses from relevant internal (e.g. committees) or external bodies (e.g. professional associations and government regulatory authorities).
- 4.3.11. The University shall provide all the necessary reports and other information as required by QHA under this agreement, in the format mutually agreed;
- 4.3.12. In event of disruption of Services by the University for any reason whatsoever and in such case, the University shall be liable to pay any and all differential expenses/costs as may be incurred by QHA without any dispute or demur.

5. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES:

- 5.1 The Parties hereby represent, warrant, undertake and covenant, that:
- 5.1.1 Parties represent and warrant to each other that neither Party will infringe upon third party's intellectual property rights nor breach any terms and conditions of Agreement.
- 5.1.2. The Parties represents and warrants that they have all necessary legal rights and requisite permissions to provide support for and/or collaborate for offering such Programme.

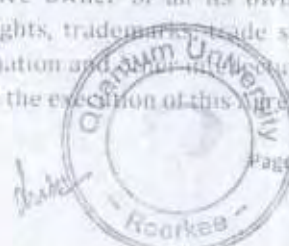

- III. The University shall not use the name of QHA, any affiliates or derivations, trademarks, trade dress, logos or the equivalent in advertising or sales materials or in any other manner without the prior written consent of QHA.
- IV.
